Worldwide Cost of Living Survey

Introduction The Worldwide Cost of Living Survey is a customised report which compares the cost of living between one city and another. This is done by an easy-to-follow index calculation which is the result of extensive local price data collected in 130 cities around the world.

Choose a city as your base—this will equal 100 on the index, and then select as many host or destination cities to make your comparison.

This sample illustrates a one-city comparison using Budapest as the base (home) city and Stockholm as the host (destination) city.

What is in the sample? **Page 1 - index page**

This is the final result of the research that has been carried out, and shows at a glance the difference in the cost of living between the base and host city.

- Note ①** The date the price data were collected and for whom it was calculated.
- Note ②** The exchange rate used for both base and host cities. Index figures can be calculated using US dollars or the euro as the global currency. The euro can be used as the local currency also.
- Note ③** The local inflation rate for both base and host cities.
- Note ④** The basket of goods divided into ten categories which is used to create the weighted index calculation. Categories or individual products may be removed and the index recalculated at no extra cost.
- Note ⑤** The mean index. This shows at a glance the percentage difference between the average prices in the host city compared to the average prices in the base city. This represents a like-for-like comparison between the two cities.
- Note ⑥** The high index. Compares the high prices in the host city to the average prices in the base city. It allows for special provision for executives moving to a city for the first time.
- Note ⑦** A summary of the percentage differences in the cost of living between the two cities using the whole basket of goods.

Page 2 - country data

Provided for all base and host cities. General geographical, political and social issues relating to the country.

Page 3-10 Price lists

Provided for all cities. Gives prices in local currency and in US\$. Alternatively prices can be quoted in euros. Prices range from supermarket to high priced speciality stores.

The prices for all the products and services are divided into 17 sub-categories. The first 10 sub-categories are covered on the first six pages and are included in the final index calculation:

- Shopping basket
- Alcoholic beverages
- Household supplies
- Personal care
- Tobacco
- Utilities
- Clothing
- Domestic help
- Recreation & entertainment
- Transportation

The final sub-categories are not included in the index calculation but are provided so that housing allowances and business trip expenses can be calculated:

- Rented accommodation and related costs
- Cost guide for short term business trips

If you only require information from these price lists - it may be purchased separately.

Page 11 - Housing, schools & leisure

This information is provided for all cities. Additional housing information including areas surveyed, plus prices for schooling, health care and leisure activities available locally.

Page 12 - Disposable income tables

Available for over 60 key cities, showing the percentage of gross salary remaining after income tax and social security contributions are deducted. These have been calculated using TAXDISK software and are provided in local currency.

Using the product

A fully comprehensive user's manual on how to use the product is provided in the report. It gives details of the weighted index, survey methodology and other general information on expatriate compensation programmes, plus a step-by-step worked example of how to calculate an expatriate salary using a cost of living adjustment. The report itself comes in an easy-to-use ring binder so that more cities can be added at a later date if required.

Social trends	Sweden is the third largest country in western Europe. However, it has a small population, over 80% of which live in the more developed southern third of the country. Sweden has the highest proportion of elderly people in the world; 17% of the population are 65 and over. About one-third of secondary school graduates go on to higher education and the figure is rising, partly because of a sharp deterioration of employment prospects for school leavers. While health services are not free, they are heavily subsidised and are accessible to all citizens on equal terms.			
Communications	In keeping with its size and low population density, Sweden has developed more miles of railway and has more motor vehicles per head than most other European countries. The Oresund bridge and tunnel project, linking Malmo to Copenhagen in Denmark, is due to be completed in 2001. With 682 telephone connections per 1,000 inhabitants in 1996, Sweden has the highest telephone density in the world as well as, along with Finland, the highest market penetration of mobile phones.			
Economy	The economy is characterised by a highly developed and internationally successful industrial sector. The public sector is large, both in terms of employment and value. High payroll taxes subsidise an extensive welfare system—although it has been cut since 1991. Since rising to 8% in 1996, unemployment has been at the top of Sweden's political agenda.			
Political structure	Sweden is a constitutional monarchy with a unicameral parliament of 349 seats. Politics is dominated by the Social Democratic Party (SDP), which has invariably been in power since the end of the Second World War. However the SDP experienced their lowest election results for 60 years in 1998, only maintaining power with co-operation from smaller parties. Sweden became a member of the EU in 1994 but announced in 1997 that it was to delay its participation in Economic and Monetary Union (EMU).
